# 2014 British International 420 Class Open & National Championships

23 – 29 August 2014

## NOTICE OF RACE

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Competitors should note that Hayling Island SC implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book.
- 1.3 The Exoneration Penalty, and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available.

### 2 ADVERTISING & IDENTIFICATION

Boats may be required to display bow numbers and advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

### 3 ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the International 420 class sailed by helms and crews who are members or affiliates of the International 420 Class Association.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form accessed via the 420 GBR website by 22 August 2014 and submitting the entry fee. Entries will only be accepted after 22 August at the discretion of the organizing authority.
- 3.3 **Parent/Guardian Declarations:** All helms and crews under 18 years of age during the event shall submit signed Parent/Guardian Declarations (download from the website) either online, by post or at registration.

### 4 FEES

Entry fee per boat:

Received before 1 August: £270

Received after 1 August: £320

The fee is inclusive of tickets for the championship dinner.

### 5 FORMAT OF RACING

It is intended to run the event as a single series, but with the option to divide the fleet and run racing as a qualifying series and final series. Details will be provided in the sailing instructions.

### 6 SCHEDULE

6.4 There will be a briefing for competitors at 10:00 on Monday 25 August.

6.5 The sailing instructions will specify a time on the last day of racing after which no warning signal may be made.

## 7 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

7.1 Each boat shall produce a valid measurement certificate at registration.

7.2 All boats shall go through the Championship equipment inspection process before racing. A single suit of measured sails will be stamped with the regatta stamp, and only these sails may be used in the Championships. Separate arrangements may be made for boats returning from the 2014 EUROROSAF Youth Sailing European Championship.

7.3 420 class rule C.10.3.1 (c) shall apply for any all-female entry. The red rhombus required may be purchased at registration.

## 8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be published on the event website, and will be available at registration.

## 9 VENUE

9.1 The racing area will be Hayling Bay with Chichester Harbour as an option in the case of bad weather.

## 10 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be trapezoid or windward/leeward. The target time for each race will be 45 minutes for the leading boat.

## 11 SCORING

11.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a regatta.

11.2 The scoring system including the number of excluded races will be described in full in the sailing instructions.

## 12 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall register at the Race Office during the registration period.

## 13 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places whilst in the boat park.

## 14 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Whilst on the water, a boat shall not carry equipment capable of making or receiving radio communications, except for equipment provided by the organizing authority. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## **15 PRIZES**

### **15.1 Trophy Definitions:**

- (a) Boats sailed by a helm & crew who both hold or are entitled to hold a United Kingdom passport, and who are members of the British 420 Class Association, will be eligible for National Champion.
- (b) Boats sailed by a helm & crew who are both under 19 and over 17 on 31 December 2014 will be eligible for youth prizes.
- (c) Boats sailed by a helm & crew who are both under 17 on 31 December 2014 will be eligible for junior prizes.
- (d) Boats sailed by a helm & crew who are both over 21 on 30 August 2014 (last day of the championships) will be eligible for master's prizes.

### **15.2 Trophies will be awarded according to the following schedule:**

- (a) British International 420 Class Open Championship Trophy - Open Champion
- (b) The Curradinghy Trophy
- (c) British Championship Challenge Trophy - National Champion
- (d) The Hardy Trophy - Junior National Champion
- (e) John Tew Trophy - Youth National Champion
- (f) Corinthian Bowl - Ladies National Champion
- (g) Cohn Masters Trophy - Masters National Champion

### **15.3 Further prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the organizing authority.**

## **16 RIGHTS TO USE NAMES & LIKENESSES**

Competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

## **17 RISK STATEMENT**

17.1 Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

17.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

## **18 INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2million per event or the equivalent.
