Notice of Race (NOR)

Organising Authority is Australian Sailing Ltd Host Club Adelaide Sailing Club













[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Protest Committee in accordance with Addendum J1. Australian Sailing recommended DPs are listed in Addendum J1-A.

[SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty will be applied by the race committee without a hearing in accordance with Addendum J1. SPs for this event are listed in Addendum J1-B.

[NP] denotes a rule which shall not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)
- 1.2 The Australian Sailing Prescriptions shall apply to all entries.
- 1.3 Appendix P will apply as changed by instruction 2.5.
- 1.4 RRS P2.3 will not apply and RRS P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one.
- 1.5 (SP) Australian Sailing Special Regulation Part 2 Off the Beach Boats, will apply. It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure that life jackets comply with a standard equivalent to those listed in the regulations and accepted under local law.
- 1.5 Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42 will apply.
- 1.6 Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.
- 1.7 The Optimist Green Fleet will be governed by the World Sailing Introductory Rules of Sailing.

2 (NP) (DP) Advertising and Bow Numbers

2.1 Boats may be required to display bow numbers and/or advertising as required by the Organising Authority.

3 Eligibility & Entry

- 3.1 Competitors shall enter and support boats shall register for the event by completing the on-line entry form on the event website www.sailingyouth.org.au and paying the required fees. On-line entry opens on 17January 2019 and late entry fees apply after midnight 4th March 2019. Entries may be cancelled, at the discretion of the Organising Authority, after the close of entries should a Class not meet the minimum number by 7 March 2019.
- 3.2 The regatta is open to the following classes.

- 3.3 Other classes may be included and classes may be merged at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 3.4 Competitors must be under 19 years of age at 31 December 2019.
- 3.5 All competitors shall be members of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing or a World Sailing MNA.
- 3.6 Parents/Guardians of Competitors under the age of 18 shall acknowledge and agree to the Entry Declaration via the online entry system at the time of entry. Competitor registration forms will be made available at the registration desk on the day of registration to check details from the online registration.
- 3.7 Entrants and their Parents/Guardians and Support Personnel agree to be bound by Australian Sailing Member Protection Policy, the Racing Rules of Sailing, and any policies and rules set down by the host club.
- 3.8 A confirmation email and receipt will be sent to the nominated email address once an entry has been made. Entries will be displayed on the event website.
- 3.9 By entering the championships competitors agree to comply with The Code of Conduct contained in the online registration.

4 Entry Fees

4.1 Fees are stated in AUD and include any local taxes (GST).

4.2 If any entry is cancelled by the competitor, the entry fee will be refunded as follows:

Cancellation Date Entry Fee Refund

Three weeks before the event 100%
Two weeks before the event 50%
One week before the event 0%

4.3 If a class is cancelled due to low entry numbers, a full refund will be provided.

5 Schedule

5.1 The regatta office for competitors, support boats and schedule of races shall be as follows

- 5.2 A maximum of 8 races are scheduled, with no more than 3 races being sailed back to back without a break ashore.
- 5.3 No warning signal will be made after 1600hrs on the last scheduled day of racing.





6 (NP) (DP) Equipment Inspection

6.1 Boats shall comply with RRS 78 and may be subject to equipment inspection or asked to produce a valid certificate at any time during the event.

7 Sailing Instructions

7.1 Sailing Instructions will be available one week before the event on the website and will be posted on the Official Notice Board. Other documents governing the event may be published with the Sailing Instructions.

8 Venue

- 8.1 The regatta will be conducted at Adelaide Sailing Club, 9 Barcoo Rd, West Beach.
- 8.2 Please see Attachment B Site Plan. Access to, and boat storage at the venue will be available from midday Friday 8th March until 8pm Sunday 10th March 2019. Access to and boat storage at the venue outside of these times must be arranged in advance on an individual basis with the venue (see Attachment A for contact details).

9 The Course

9.1 As described in the Sailing Instructions (SI).

10 Penalty System

10.1 .

10.2 For the 29er and Bic Techno 293 events, RRS 44.1 and P2.1 are changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

11 Jury

11.1 A National Jury may be constituted in accordance with "Addendum A – Australian Sailing policy on the denial of the right of appeals". Decisions of the National jury will be final, in accordance with RRS Rule 70.5. A copy of the letter of approval issued by Australian Sailing will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

12 Scoring

- 12.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.2 When fewer than six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 12.3 When from six to eight races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

13 (NP) (DP) Support Boats

- 13.1 All support boats shall be <u>registered</u> with the Organising Authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and event support boat regulations and the RRS. The Organising Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registration at their sole discretion. Life jackets are to be worn by all personnel on registered support vessels. A copy of the regulations are available at <u>safety-equipment-for-powered-vessels</u> and <u>life</u> jacket laws.
- 13.2 All support boats shall keep to leeward of the start line and its extensions between the preparatory signal and the start signals and more than 50 metres clear of any competing boat or mark of the course, between the start signal and the finish of the last boat, except when asked to assist by the Race Committee.
- 13.3 All support boats are required to carry a working VHF Radio.





14 Berthing

14.1 Boats shall be kept in their assigned places either in the dinghy park or afloat as described by the Host Club during registration and check-in. Road trailers shall not to be left within the rigging area during the regatta. All trailers may be stored in the areas designated by the Host Club. Any trailers left within the boat park may be moved / relocated at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

15 Radio Communications

15.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions, text messages or cellular phone calls while afloat except in an emergency or when using equipment provided by the race committee.

16 Prizes

- 16.1 Prizes will be awarded for the first three placed boats in each class.
- 16.2 Other prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

17 Disclaimer

17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority or Host Club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

18 Insurance

- 18.1 Each competing boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD \$5,000,000 (recommended \$10,000,000) per incident or the equivalent.
- 18.2 The Organising Authority may request a copy of the Certificate of Currency.

19 Media Rights

- 19.1 By participating in this event competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority, and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 19.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the Organising Authority.
- 19.3 Competitors may be required for media interviews or press conferences at the regatta.


